**Minor Hours: 21**

Students may choose virtually any major (along with this minor) including: History, Communication, English, Business, Criminal Justice, Psychology, Information Technology, Math, Biology, and Spanish. Law schools recommend that students take a broad range of challenging liberal arts courses. In addition to their major advisor, students are assigned a pre-law advisor in the department of history and social studies. Students must have at least a 2.8 GPA in his/her minor. Before acceptance into the Pre-Law program, students must meet with the Chair of the Department of History and Social Studies for an oral interview and an orientation session. Elective courses may not be used to meet requirements for the student's major or minor.
