

RESPONSIBLE EMPLOYEES

All faculty, staff, administrators, RA's and student campus safety officers at Grace are considered "responsible employees" and required to report knowledge of sexual harassment and violence or related Grace policy violations to the Title IX Office.

CONFIDENTIAL SOURCES

Only the following individuals are *confidential sources* and *NOT* required to make a report to the Title IX Office using identifying information:

1. Campus counselors and interns working for the Grace Health and Counseling Center
2. Campus Chaplain
3. Campus Nurse
4. Athletic Trainers

What is Title IX?

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a federal civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in educational programs and activities receiving federal funding, including colleges and universities.

All students have the right to pursue an education free from sex discrimination, including sexual violence and harassment.

Sexual Misconduct Policy

Grace's complete policy about sexual misconduct is available on its web site as well as in the following campus offices: Title IX, campus safety, athletics office and trainers, human resources, student affairs, learning center, chapel, and the health and counseling center.

You Have the Right to:

1. Be informed about all reporting options.
2. Be free from pressure to make a police report.
3. Have reports investigated by the Title IX Office.
4. Be notified about available on-campus and off-campus resources whether or not a police report is made.
5. Be informed about safety and other protective measures.
6. Receive assistance from Grace in requesting changes to academic, living, transportation, and working situations.
7. Be free from retaliation for making a report or participating in an investigation.

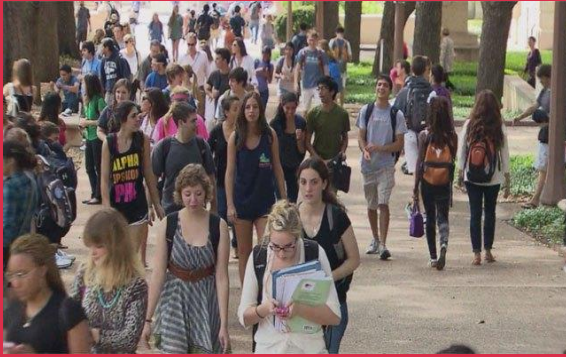

Getting Immediate Help

Individuals who have been the victim of conduct that is the subject of Grace's Title IX sexual assault policy or who have witnessed such conduct should take the following immediate steps to protect their health and safety:

1. Seek medical, law enforcement, counseling, and/or mental health help for immediate health, safety, and well-being protections.
2. Individuals living locally near the Winona Lake campus should immediately call 911 or contact the Winona Lake Police Department (574-267-8622) or the Warsaw Police Department (574-372-9511).
3. All others should call 911 or contact their local law enforcement office.
4. If the responding party is a Grace student or employee, all reports should be made to the Title IX Office or a confidential source.
5. To avoid destroying forensic evidence, victims of sexual battery should not bathe, shower, or change clothing until appropriate evidence can be evaluated and preserved.

REPORTING OPTIONS

Grace does not automatically notify law enforcement of reports made to the Title IX Office.

You are not required to file a crime report or request a legal protective order, but may do so at any time and request the assistance of someone at Grace.

Reports to the Title IX Office will proceed regardless of whether a criminal report is filed with law enforcement.

Reports of sexual assault may occur by:

1. Filing a criminal report with your local police department.
2. Filing a report with the Grace College Title IX office.
3. Reporting the assault to a Grace College confidential source.
