Master of Divinity Program Review:

As a result of a comprehensive program review, the faculty committee recognized that Grace Seminary is unique in comparison to other benchmark institutions. Biblical/Theological training has always been and continues to be a substantial part of the MDiv program core curriculum. It is believed that this level of rigor provides a comprehensive theological framework, which allows the student to be exposed to a variety of evangelical theological viewpoints. Because Grace's program learning goals do not adhere to a particular denomination or theological system, students have the freedom to critically assess their views and prepare for leadership in a variety of ecclesiastical settings.

A strategic result of the MDiv program review has been the development of additional concentrations for students preparing for specialized ministry within the local church.
