GTS Mission:

Grace Theological Seminary is a learning community dedicated to teaching, training and transforming the whole person for local church and global ministry. This purpose is accomplished through quality instruction in biblical literature, including the original languages in some degrees, the study of various systems of theological thought, exposure to past and present movements in Christian history and missions, the development of communicative and administrative skills, the cultivation of spiritual life, and encouragement in various kinds of Christian service. The objective is to provide pastors, teachers, missionaries, evangelists and other leaders for evangelical Christian ministries throughout the world.

Institutional Update:

Grace Seminary was pleased to receive two significant Lilly Endowment Grants, totaling \$2.5 million, over the past several years, which will provide funding for increased theological training at various academic and professional levels. The grants acknowledge the work of Grace Theological Seminary as a key institution that effectively prepares leaders for current challenges in ministry.

Program Updates:

The MA in Ministry Studies (MAMS) created a new concentration in technology, in order to equip ministry leaders to navigate the virtual world that impacts faith communities.

The Doctor of Ministry degree has progressed from one to five specializations: intercultural studies, pastoral studies, ministry leadership, advanced expository preaching, interdisciplinary studies.
