Grace College Direct Admission

In our Lancer Direct plan, Grace College allows your administrators to submit seniors for direct admission to Grace. Your school will provide Grace College with the students' basic contact information, GPA, and Christian commitment. In keeping with our primary admission criteria, we require a 3.0 GPA* and confirmation of a relationship with Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Grace then provides your student's nonbinding admission offer within one week with **a generous financial aid package, guaranteed merit scholarships**, and full-tuition coverage for many Indiana families earning \$60,000 or less per year. Students with a 3.75 GPA or higher often qualify for our Presidential Scholarship Competition as well, allowing them to compete for increased scholarships.

Following direct admission, our Grace College admissions counselors will assist students with the necessary steps to reserve a place in our beautiful residence halls, register for PreUnion Lake Day, and more! Our team looks forward to serving your students and their families.
