



How You Can Get Supportive Measures

Grace's Title IX Office can provide supportive measures even if you don't file a formal complaint. This includes:

- Academic support
- Housing changes
- Mutual No Contact Directives
- Additional safety measures
- Counseling services
- Health services

Consent

Consent is knowing and voluntary, and requires clear words or actions that are mutually understandable in their meaning and create clear permission regarding willingness to engage in (and the conditions of) each form of sexual contact.

Preserving Evidence

Save texts and messages

If you want a forensic exam:

- Don't change your clothes.
- Don't shower or bathe.
- Don't use the bathroom.
- Don't brush your teeth.

What Title IX Prohibits

Title IX is a federal law that prohibits sex-based harassment and discrimination including:

- Dating violence
- Discrimination based on sex
- Domestic violence
- Retaliation
- Sexual assault
 - Non-consensual sexual contact
 - Non-consensual intercourse
- Stalking
