



### **SUPPORTIVE MEASURES**

Supportive measures are made available free of charge regardless of whether a formal Title IX complaint is made or a criminal report made to law enforcement or campus safety. Supportive measures include, but are not limited to:

- Referral to counseling, medical, health, or other confidential services
- Academic support, extensions of deadlines, or other course/program-related support
- Modification of class schedules, including transferring sections or withdrawal from a course, or if both Parties are enrolled in the same course
- Altering campus housing assignment(s) or housing locations
- Voluntary changes in on-campus work reporting structure, schedule, or job assignment
- Campus safety escort, transportation, and other safety planning steps
- Mutual No Contact Directives, an administrative remedy designed to restrict contact and communication between two or more individuals
- Increased security and monitoring of certain areas of campus
- Referral to campus and community resources for victim advocacy
- Referral to Confidential Resources
- Referral to legal assistance, such as obtaining a protective order
- Referral for assistance with financial aid, visa, or immigration concerns
- Consideration of leave requests
- Assistance in obtaining a sexual assault forensic exam, including transportation
- Assistance in requesting academic or other adjustments through the Office of Disabilities Services (students) or Human Resources (employees) if the individual qualifies as a person with a disability, or requests translation or other specific services to participate in the TIX process
- Other similar measures if reasonably available
